# The Certificate of Public Need Review Process is Established in:

- The Code of Virginia at §32.1-102.1 through §32.1-102.11
- Virginia Medical Care Facilities Certificate of Public Need Rules and Regulations 12VAC 5-220

#### And

The State Medical Facilities Plan 12VAC 5-230
through 12VAC 5-360

### **The Pre-Application Phase**

- Formally starts at least 70 days prior to the start of the established Batch Review Cycle
  - Receipt of a Letter of Intent from the applicant
  - Response from Virginia Department of Health within seven days

## **The Pre-Application Phase**

 Application Received from the Applicant at least 40 Days Prior to the Start of the Review Cycle

 DCOPN and RHPA have up to 10 days to review the submission for completeness and transmit follow-up questions to the applicant

# The Pre-Application Phase

- The applicant must provide responses to the "Completeness Follow-up" Questions at least 5 days prior to the Start of the Review Cycle
  - Responses must be adequate to complete the application
  - Application fee also due

## **Application Review Phase**

- Begins on the first day of the batch review cycle
- Dates established in the Virginia Medical Care Facilities Certificate of Public Need Rules and Regulations

# **Application Review Phase**

- By the 60<sup>th</sup> day of the Review Cycle the RHPA will:
  - Hold a public hearing
  - Hold a meeting of any local advisory council
  - Hold a meeting of the RHPA Board of Directors

# **Application Review Phase**

#### • The DCOPN will:

 Complete the review of the COPN request and transmit a recommendation to the applicant by the 70<sup>th</sup> Day of the Cycle

- For uncontested COPN Requests recommended for approval by both the RHPA and the DCOPN
  - the record closes on the 75<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle, and
  - The request and analysis are sent to the State Health Commissioner for a decision

- For contested COPN Requests and/or those recommended for denial by either/both the RHPA and the DCOPN
  - the need for an informal fact-finding conference (IFFC) determination is made on the 75<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle
  - Petitions for good cause from challenging parties are due by the 80<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle
  - An IFFC will be held between the 80<sup>th</sup> and 90<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle

- For the requests heard at an IFFC
  - The record will close within 30 days of the IFFC (between the 110<sup>th</sup> and 120<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle)
  - The State Health Commissioner's decision is due within 45 days of the close of the record (between the 155<sup>th</sup> and 165<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle)

- If the State Health Commissioner cannot transmit a decision by the deadline, an additional 25 days can be added (180<sup>th</sup> to 190<sup>th</sup> day).
- Projects are deemed approved if no decision is made by the 190<sup>th</sup> day of the review cycle

#### Performance

- In Fiscal Years 2003 through 2005
  - 507 letters of intent were received
  - 373 applications were received
  - 287 decisions were made by the State Health Commissioner
    - 260 (90.6%) approved
    - 27 (9.4%) denied

#### Performance

- The approved requests represent a 3-year capital expenditure of \$2,293,000,000
- The denied projects represent a 3-year capital request of \$165,920,000

- Each year the State Health Commissioner makes a report to the Governor and the General Assembly of Virginia
- Each report is required to analyze several project types and offer recommendations as to the appropriateness of continuing the certificate of public need program for those project types

- 3 basic types of recommendations have been made in recent years
- **1.** Support efforts to deregulate COPN as it applies to the discussed service

Recommended for lithotripsy, obstetrical services, ICF/MR, nuclear medicine imaging

2. Continue to apply the COPN program, as currently developed, to the discussed service, with the modification of the State Medical Facilities Plan, as needed.

Recommended for nursing homes, PET, MRI, CT, and MSI

3. Expand the Request for Applications (RFA) process to include the discussed service based on a collaborative review with affected parties to determine the need for, and location of, such additional facilities and services.

Recommended for radiation therapy, gamma knife, neonatal special care, medical rehabilitation and long term acute care hospitals
