CWPT is the number one entity protecting Civil War battlefield land in the United States. We have helped to preserve more than 23,000 acres in 19 states. ■ Since 1999, CWPT has protected Civil War battlefield land at three times the rate of the National Park Service.



Civil War Preservation Trust How Do We Protect Land?

CWPT protects land through outright purchases and conservation easements from willing sellers.
 We work in partnership with federal, state and municipal officials and local preservationists.

 CWPT leverages private donations from our 70,000 members with government matching grants.



Civil War Preservation Trust Preserving Virginia's Civil War Heritage

- CWPT has protected more than 11,000 acres in the Old Dominion.
- This year, we have saved land at Fredericksburg, Glendale, Deep Bottom, and Port Republic.
 Since 1999, CWPT has secured \$18 million in federal battlefield grants for Virginia sites.
- Just last month, Interior Secretary announced \$2 million grant for Slaughter Pen Farm.

Civil War Preservation Trust Promoting Appreciation of History

In addition to preservation, CWPT promotes appreciate of Civil War history.

- Developed a Civil War history curriculum that was adopted by the state of South Carolina.
- Hosts popular annual Teachers Institute.
- Outreach programs that encourage tourism and volunteerism.

Heritage Tourism is a low-impact economic engine.
 Civil War visitors to Virginia tend to stay for 4.1 nights and spend \$547 per visit.






Civil War Preservation Trust Positioned to Help Promote Sesquicentennial
