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The National Picture: More Individuals Than Ever In Prison and Leaving Prison

➤1.3 million prisoners in state institutions

And the majority (95%) will be going home someday

Approximately 670,000 prisoners will leave state prisons this year—nearly 40% growth in 10 years.

Characteristics of the Returning Prison Population

- 80% have a history of substance abuse.
- 16% are diagnosed with a mental illness.
- Many are or will become homeless.
- 2 3% of has HIV or AIDS.

Challenges to Successful Reentry

> Uncoordinated service systems.

Cuts in funding for prison programs.

Systemic and legal barriers.

Strategies to Improving Prisoner Reentry

Develop an interagency approach—reentry is not only a corrections issue.
Improve how prisoners are prepared for release in prison.
Improve how prisoners are released from prison.
