NOTE TO CHAIRMAN: After the Committee's deliberations, two issues will remain: (i) Guidelines for legislation on use and abuse of technologies and (ii) Event Data Recorders and Black Boxes in Vehicles. While we discussed the various technologies, we are far from recommending guidelines (NOTE: one department is currently study the use of RFID for tracking products and should have useful information for us next summer). In addition, the black box technology is evolving (e.g., proposals across the nation to switch from gas tax to tax by mile and track it; uses of black boxes in trucks; and NHTSA proposals on EDRs). I suggest that we continue to track the issues and take them up next year.
