The Honorable Benjamin J. Lambert, III, Chairman of the *Brown v. Board of Education* Scholarship Awards Committee, today announced the availability of applications for the 2007-2008 scholarship cycle. The *Brown* Scholarship Program was established by the Virginia General Assembly in 2004 to assist persons who were enrolled or eligible to enroll in the public schools of Virginia during Massive Resistance between 1954 and 1964, in localities (Charlottesville, Norfolk, Prince Edward County, and Warren County) in which the public schools were closed to avoid desegregation. Eligible persons must be current domiciled residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Scholarships may be used to cover the costs *only* of tuition and books, as permitted by the Committee, at accredited Virginia public schools and institutions of higher education. Eligible persons may use the scholarship for:

- Transitional education programs to prepare them for success in GED and adult education programs
- GED certificate
- Adult high school diploma
- College Level Examination Program (CLEP) credit
- Career-technical skills training at public two-year colleges
- Two-year or four-year undergraduate degree at accredited Virginia institutions, part-time or full-time
