- Present the history of public education in Virginia during Massive Resistance era prior to visit to model school
- Request the issuance of a Superintendent's Memorandum with resources for teachers, e.g. C-SPAN's broadcast of the UVA Conference on Massive Resistance and the Encyclopedia Virginia

II. Website

- 50th Anniversary of Public School Closings is posted on MLK Commission website
- Development of menu ongoing

III. Preservation of Historical Records and Facilities

- Produce a film concerning Massive Resistance in Virginia as a legacy project
- Highlight localities in which public schools were closed
- Invite historians and scholars to submit writings on each locality
- Use a power point presentation and other technology to educate the public regarding Virginia's history and the role of the relevant locality during Massive Resistance. The presentation should be a component of the Commission's public relations package and used in advertisements prior to the Subcommittee's visit to the locality
- Request public libraries to exhibit artifacts and records from the Massive Resistance Era, and make use of virtual exhibits to facilitate greater public access, e.g. You Tube, Facebook, etc.
- Ask local school boards to prepare a message regarding the history of desegregation in their school division for the commemoration. The messages should be assembled for distribution statewide.
- Explore the possibility of engaging law school students and student journalists to assist the Subcommittee in gathering the information
