HJR 611(2007): Purpose

- To study science and technology education in business, law, and policy graduate programs at the Commonwealth's institutions of higher education.
- To study ways to provide incentives for students to pursue careers in these sectors.

HJR 611 (2007): Charges

- Review the curricula of existing graduate programs in business, law, and policy at the Commonwealth's institutions of higher education
- Review and recommend innovative ways to encourage students to specialize in science and technology in their respective business, law, or policy graduate programs

HJR 611 (2007): Charges, cont'd

- Examine ways to encourage partnerships between the business, law, and policy graduate programs and the math, science, engineering, and technology graduate programs
- Examine ways to encourage partnerships between the business, law, and policy graduate programs and science and technology based businesses

HJR 611 (2007): Parameters

- One year study authorized for 4 meetings
- Ex officio members serve with voting privileges
- Meetings must be completed by November 30, 2007
- Chairman shall submit an executive summary of the subcommittee's findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2008 Session
