Need for Mental Health services

- 1 in 5 children are identified as needing a mental health (MH) service
- Only about a third of these children receive MH service
- School as the de facto MH provider
- Juvenile justice system is next level of system default

Now Is the Time Goal 1

- Develop a multi-tiered model that integrates a comprehensive systems approach for addressing the mental health needs of children and youth
- Piloted within three selected school divisions: <u>Montgomery County, Pulaski</u> <u>County and Fairfax County</u>

Now Is the Time Goal 2

 Integrate a multi-tiered systems framework for the delivery of mental health services that will increase the efficiency of systems at the state and local levels to advance collaboration, capacity, integration, and coordination of services

Now Is the Time Goal 3

 Expand the availability and delivery of Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) and Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) throughout the Commonwealth to increase early identification and intervention in cases of mental health distress in Virginia's youth

School Mental Health

 Involves partnership between schools and community health/mental health organizations, as guided by <u>families and</u> youth

 Builds on <u>existing school programs</u>, services, and strategies

Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA)

 Evidence-based curriculum that provides adult gatekeepers with information to identify youth experiencing problems with mental health and substance abuse and make referrals to supports services within the school and/or in the community

State Management Team

 Works to align policies and procedure to overcome barriers hindering local education, mental health and other youth/family services providers

 Provides state and local level systems with a continuous feedback loop during this transforming process

Shared Purpose: Mental Health and School Climate

- Schools supporting/promoting mental health of all students
- Prevention, early access, interventions, according to level of need
- School personnel feel confident and competent in identifying and intervening with accuracy and effectiveness
