# Follow-up on Mental Health discussion from May 4, 2021, meeting.

- 19 Sheriffs answered VSA survey for the 12-month period ending April 30, 2021.



- How many TDO's exceeded 72 hours in duration?
  - **66** TDO's exceeded 72 hours in duration
- Why?
  - Bed space unavailable



- What happened?
  - At least some are street-ed
  - Some deputy sheriffs “stay in place” to provide security



- Drop off centers:
  - All responses indicated “Drop off center” work well
  - Several indicated more staff needed to maintain hours of operation



## Take Away:

- Public Safety Concerns:
  - Patient are being street-ed, because TDO expires
- More beds/staff needed:
  - Fund private hospitals to serve needed patients. It will also relieve LE pressure
- Fund additional level of services of Alternative Transportation Providers – immediate relieve on LE.
