
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# 1. School nurses promote wellness through prevention and early intervention services

## 2. Schools are serving students with ever more complex and chronic health needs.



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
### 3. Social conditions that contribute to poor health are more common than ever.



- Common challenges faced by school nurses in Title 1 schools



Vaccine noncompliance



<b>Education</b>	Usually Bachelor's Degree or advanced degree	12 Month Certificate Program	Usually High School Diploma
<b>Independence</b>	Practices Independently	Supervision by RN, MD, or NP required	Supervised by nurse
<b>Scope of Practice</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Physical Assessments</li> <li>Supervision and Training</li> <li>Develops training resources</li> <li>Community health partnerships and planning</li> <li>Participation in collaborative teams</li> <li>Emergency response</li> <li>Develops Care Plans and emergency action plans</li> <li>Only school health professional designated to perform all school health tasks without supervision</li> </ul>	<p>Under the direction of an RN:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Performs nursing tasks including medication administration, first aid and health education</li> <li>Provides 1:1 Support for students with special procedures</li> </ul>	<p>Under the direction of the nurse:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Conducts mandated screenings</li> <li>Administers medication with supervision</li> <li>Inputs student health data</li> </ul>
